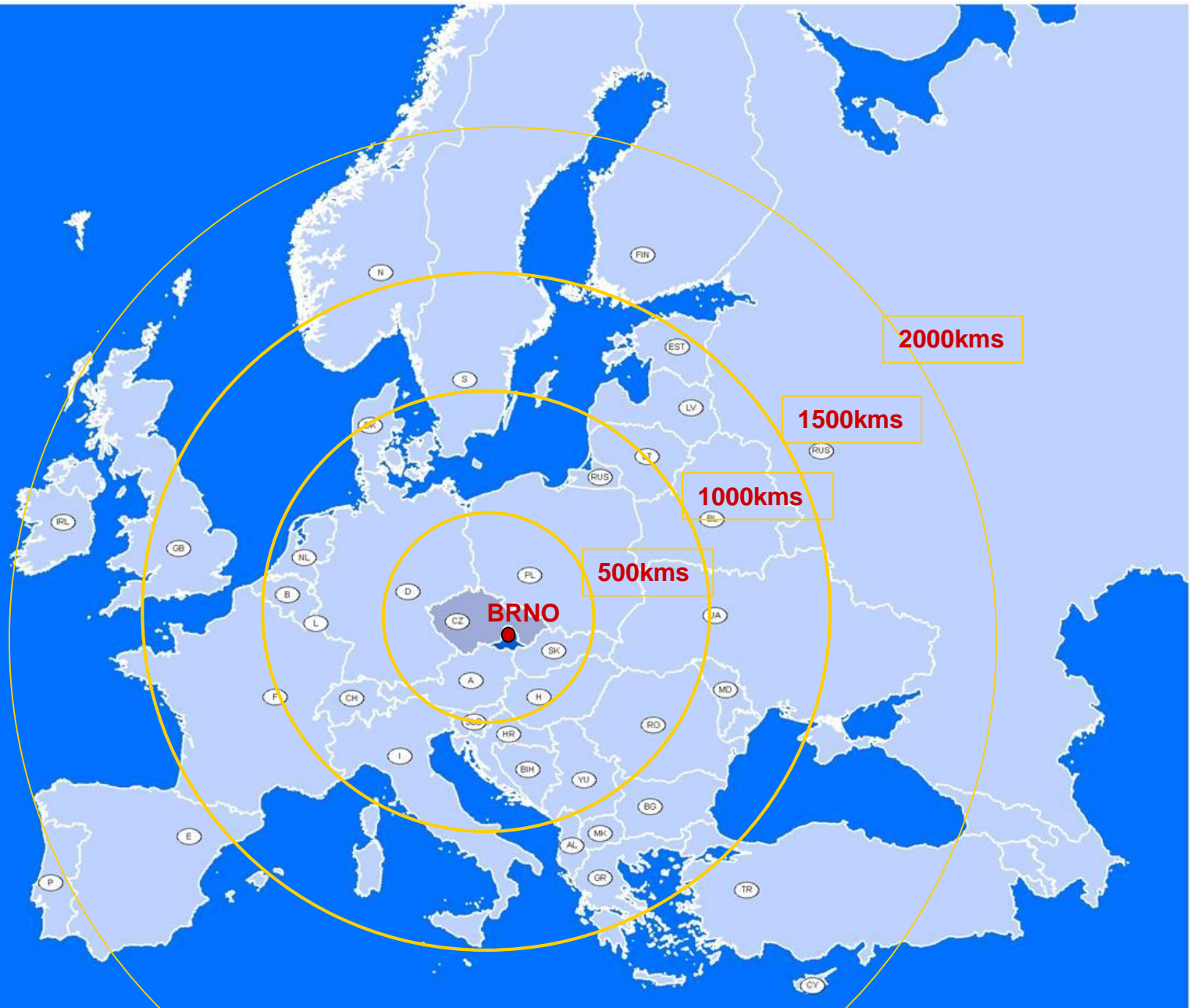




Masaryk University – brief facts



The City of Brno:

- 2nd largest city in the Czech Republic
- population of approx. 400 thousand
- historical capital of Moravia
- judicial capital of the CR
- 5 public universities
- 1 military academy
- 6 minor private HE institutions
- nearly 70 thousand university students
- IT hub of the CR
- „a little Vienna“

Basic facts & figures:

- second largest Czech university (32 539 thousand students: October 31, 2017)
- second oldest university teaching in Czech
- more than 21% international students of 100 nationalities
- approx. 200 thousand graduates since 1922
- graduates' unemployment rate less than 2% two years after graduation
- approx. 5 360 employees (as of December 31, 2017)
- approx. 2 250 pedagogical staff (as of December 31, 2017)
 - 268 full professors
 - 488 assoc. professors
 - student/teacher ratio 14,5



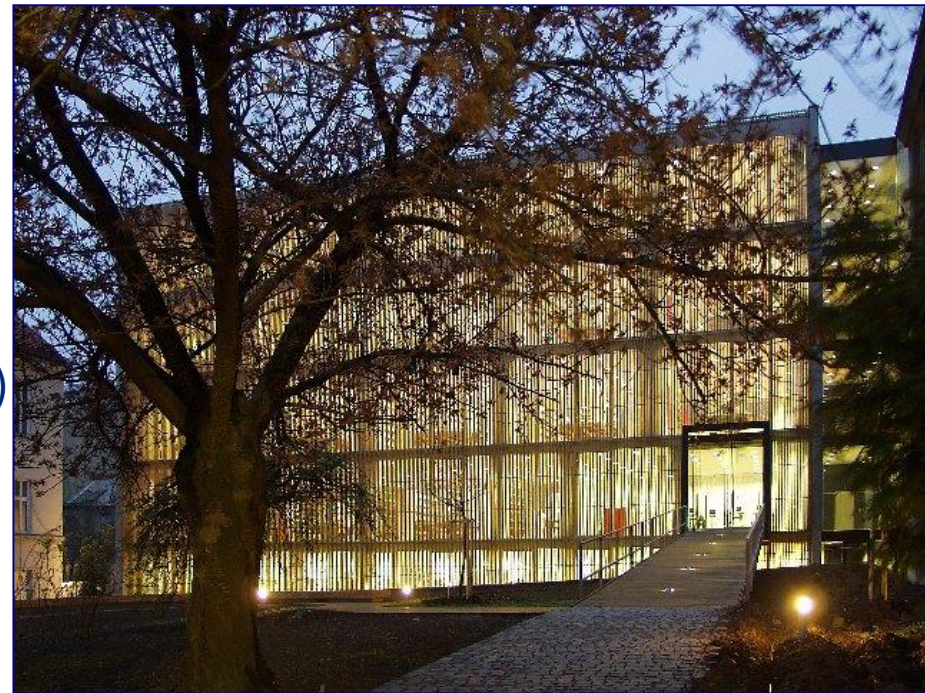
New campus – main entrance

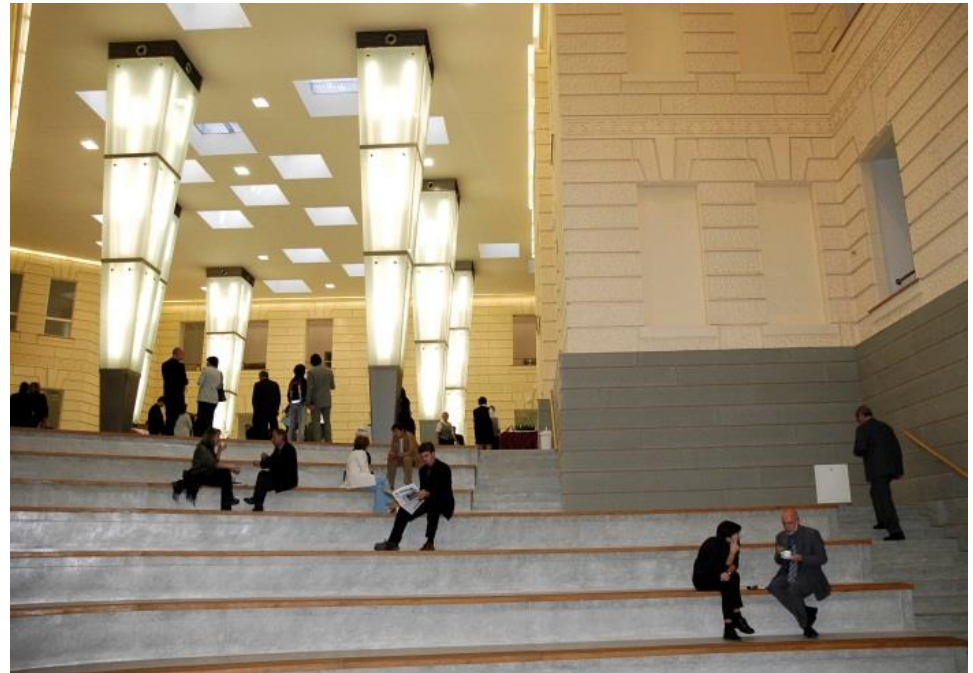

Internationalization:

- the first university ever to receive the EAIE award for innovation in internationalization
- ± 2000 outgoing and ± 1500 incoming students (2017)
- the largest number of outgoing students for work placements in the CR
- 18,5% of MU graduates have international experience
- approx. 1200 agreements with more than 600 European universities within the Erasmus+ programme
- more than 120 bilateral university agreements and 100 faculty agreements
- no. 4 in the EU with 44 Erasmus Mundus projects
- at least 300 visiting teachers every year



Research:

- no. 3 in research in the CR after the Academy of Sciences and Charles University
- about 1000 original research papers with IF each year
- recent papers published in e.g.:
 - Nature
 - Nature Genetics
 - Science
 - Cell
 - Plant Cell
 - Stem Cells
 - Genes & Development
 - Cancer Research
 - Angewandte Chemie

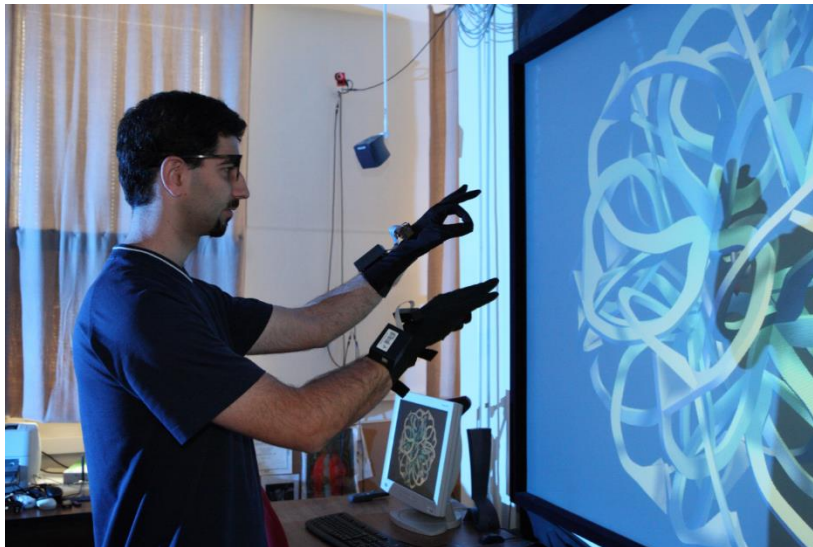
Research infrastructure:

Central European Institute of Technology (CEITEC)



- consortium project of 6 partners
- total cost of 202 M € (106 M € MU)
- 557 researchers (2015 figure)
- 63 research groups
- 25,000 m² of new laboratories
- advanced nanotechnologies and microtechnologies
- advanced materials
- structural biology
- genomics and proteomics of plant systems
- brain and mind research
- molecular medicine
- molecular veterinary medicine

- Research Centre for Toxic Compounds in the Environment (RECETOX)
- Centre of Experimental, Systematic and Ecological Biology (CESEB)



- Centre for Research, Education and Innovations in IT (CÉRIT)
- Centre for Research on Cryptography and Security (CROCS)
- Cybernetic polygon (KYPO)

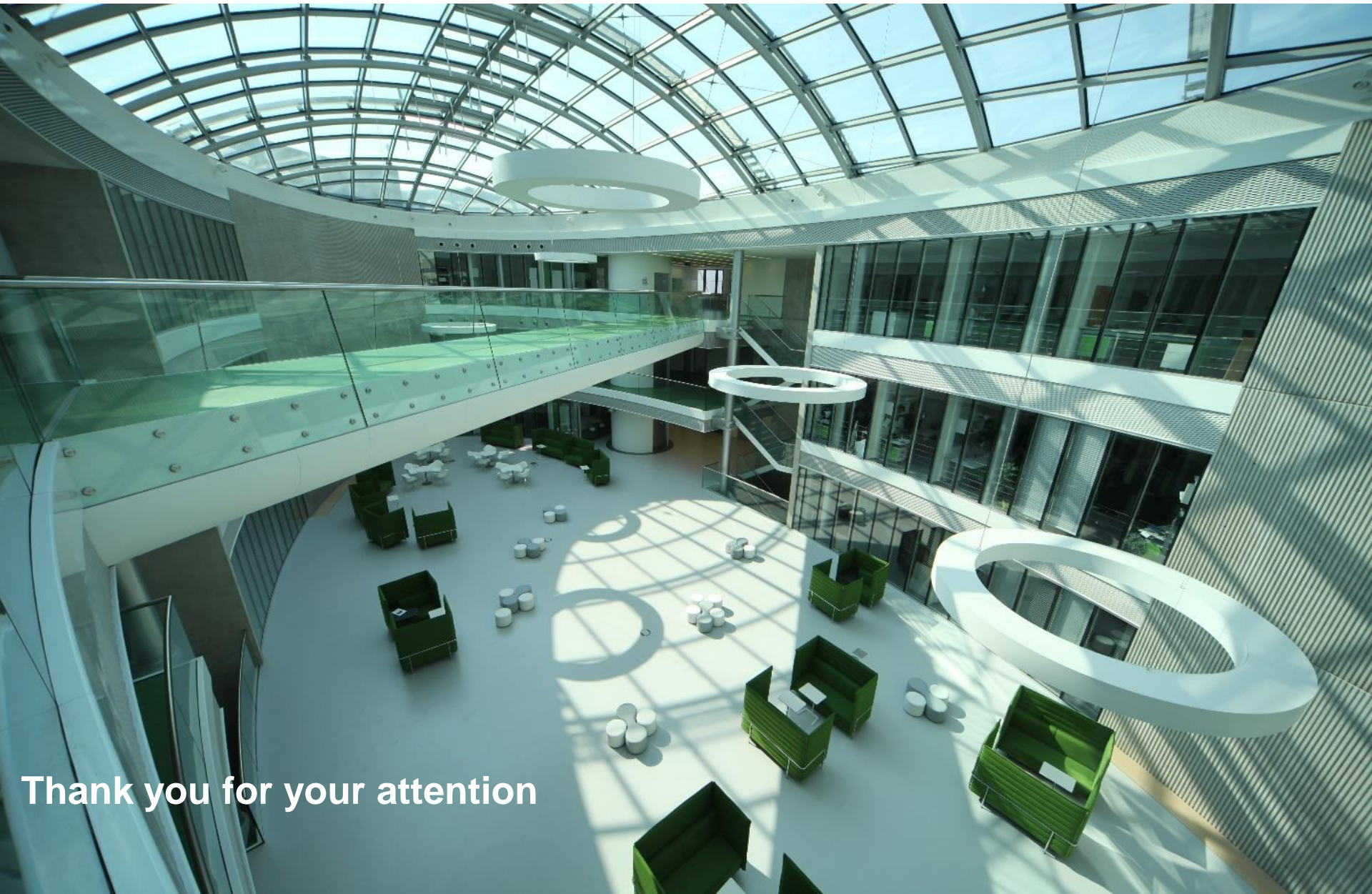
